Lakeside Speeders Beware: Lakeside authorities, fed up with speeding vehicles on Lakeside streets, are calling upon the Guys' Club and Igor Stravinsky to curb violators. Guys' Club Homeland Safety Director, Yura Gilltee, notes, "The mindless speeding on Lakeside streets has to stop. Gilltee met with Professor Knowawl of the Ohio State University Psychology Department.
