***Ice Cream Chaos:*** A sticky mess has been cleaned up after an overturned 18-wheeler delivery truck dumped 5,000 gallons of ice cream onto the major Lakeside intersection of Second and Walnut as it was rounding the corner last Wednesday afternoon.

SUVs and golf carts heading to The Patio for ice cream from east side cottages were re-routed up Central, west on 5th, north on Maple, and east on 2nd. The creamy intersection was shut down for eight hours. Guys' Club Security Officer, Betta Watchout, was on the scene within minutes calming the crowds and dispensing half-price ice cream to thousands of happy Lakesiders so as to mediate the loss.

Lakeside entrepreneurs immediately jumped in to take advantage of the chaos: The Kite Shop set up a table selling "Lakeside Ice Cream Lover" T-shirts, Marilyn's sold sets of OSU dessert dishes, The Patio posted a ice cream dish, spoon, and toppings dinner special.

According to Officer Watchout, the 26-year-old driver of the truck, Joe Wheelie, had been hauling ice cream for the past four years. Bystanders reported that he appeared to be distracted and doing something with his mouth at he approached the busy intersection. Following the accident, Guys' Club member, Phil Savage, took Wheelie to Magruder Hospital in a semi-conscious state with minor head injuries. Savage, a retired dentist, noted, "It appears that Wheelie has been dipping into his loads of ice cream for several years and clearly not brushing his teeth after his over-the-road servings. His teeth are rotten to the core."

Upon gaining consciousness in the emergency room, Wheelie confessed to not brushing regularly, but defended himself in saying, "I put in long days and I am under a lot of pressure. Sure, I don't brush enough, but I do floss once a day while I am on the road." Wheelie was ticketed for careless driving and violation of Ohio Department of Transportation No-Flossing While Driving Rule.
